Before you meet with your mentor for this module, you should have sent your second video of a sermon/teaching to your mentor, attended your second O/C conference, finished your Bible reading and memory work. When you meet with your mentor, have your mentor initial each box. When this form is completed it needs to be sent, faxed, or emailed to the District Office. If your meeting was virtual, you may initial for your mentor. Module 18 must be completed before the written ordination exam may be taken in May.

**I. Sermon/Teaching:**

Your mentor should have received a video of your sermon/teaching. During your time together, he will go over this with you using the rubric that is on-line under Vocational Ministry on our District website. Your mentor will encourage your sermon/teaching and make suggestions.

**II. Practicum:**

Each month you are to discuss with your mentor a practical area of ministry and/or practice. This month you should discuss with him:

**Personal Finances**

How does your mentor handle his/her personal finances, debt? What does she do in the area of giving? What are her plans for retirement? Does he have suggestions for you? Does she keep a budget? Has it ever worked!!!?

**Written and Oral Ordination/Consecration Exams**

What was your mentor's experience with the exams?

Where did he mess up? Where did she do well? What suggestions does he have for you in preparing?

Spend most of your time in this meeting having your mentor ask you questions like the ones you will see on the exam. She has a copy of the exam. He is not to give you this copy but he can ask questions from it to give you an idea of how the questions are worded. You will be answering these questions on paper and then orally. You should answer the questions with her orally. Practice!!

It may be beneficial to meet with your elder board to have them ask you some questions just to practice in a more formal, higher pressure setting. Contact the District Office to have them send a set of questions and answers to your elder board.

**III. Ordination/Consecration Conference:**

At this time, you should have attended your second Ordination/Consecration Conference.

They cycle every two years, so the conferences need to be attended in order. You may not skip one and attend the next one to fulfill this requirement. If you skip one, you must attend in two years and will not be ordained/consecrated until this is fulfilled.

**IV. Home Visit 2:**

By this module, you should have had your mentor and spouse to your home for a second meal together or possibly this meeting was at the home of your mentor or at a restaurant.



**V. Bible Reading:**

During this last year of preparation for ordination/consecration, you are to read the Bible one more time in a different version of your choice. To get this completed in 9 modules, you need to read about 130 chapters per module. The following chapters must be read this month.

**VI. Scripture Memory for Key Theological Doctrines on the Exam:**

- Deuteronomy 6:4
- Matthew 3:16-17

You are to quote these verses and the Biblical doctrine that it develops and supports. During these 18 modules you have memorized about 40 passages of Scripture that will greatly assist you in your exams. During this month you need to memorize about 40 more in the areas of Bibliology, Nature of God, Man and Christ, Rapture, Resurrection, Judgements, Church Discipline, verses to support the Four-Fold Gospel, Constituted Authority and verses to support our position on social issues.

This memory work will prove invaluable for your written and oral exams in May and June. Your mentor will make suggestions as to the best passages to memorize.



**VII. Discipleship:**

**Love God/Spirit Dependence:** In your Scripture reading this month, how did it impact your relationship with God? What are you hearing from the Lord? How has this impacted your love for God and dependence on His Spirit?

**Love Others/Missional Living:** How did your reading affect your relationship with others and how you love them? What have you done or said to build relationships with non-believers? Have you shared the gospel or shared your story of faith with a non-believer this month?

**Go Make Disciples/Leadership Development:** What did you do this past month to go and make disciples and build leaders? Is there something that the Lord has revealed to you where you are struggling and your mentor can encourage you and pray for you?
