



I. Ordination/Consecration Objectives:

In every generation there must be men and women who choose to walk deeply with God, embrace His mission as their own and, fully aware of the rigors of the higher path, choose to pour out their lives so that the Kingdom may advance unhindered into the future.

These men and women need to embrace the Great Commandment of our Lord and His Great Commission. As we love God, we will grow in our desperate dependence on the power of His Spirit. As we love others, we will disciple others who disciple others which will develop Godly leadership for the advancement of God's Kingdom. As we go and make disciples, we will live on mission. These are the core values of the CDCMA and are like the rails and cross ties of a train track.



This two year program is committed to developing this kind of man or woman. Each month you will be trained, equipped and then held accountable by your mentor in some aspect of deepening your Love for God, Love for Others and Going and Making Disciples.



II. Scope and Sequence:

Topics	Details
Discipleship	A very easy plan of obedience and modeling discipleship is to form a small group of 2-3 that meets once a week to discuss and practice Matthew 22 and 28. How am I loving God and depending more on His Spirit? How am I loving others by nurturing them and developing them into Godly leaders? How am I living on mission by developing relationships with the lost and seeking ways to present the Gospel to them? Each month your mentor will be asking you about who and how you are equipping others for the work of ministry. (Ephesians 4)
Practical Ministry	There are 18 practical aspects of ministry that will be covered with your mentor. Each month you will discuss a topic like: suggestions for doing a funeral, wedding, communion, devotional life, prayer life, developing a sermon/teaching, evangelism and discipleship techniques, etc. Your mentor has been prayerfully selected because of his/her experience in ministry and you will have an opportunity to glean from these experiences.
CMA Polity Course	This course will be completed as outlined in the Modules. In this course you will learn the history of this movement, her core values and distinctives, her passion to reach the lost and how she governs herself. In conjunction with this you will be writing 6 papers, 4 on the distinctives of the CMA (Christ our Savior, Healer, Sanctifier and Coming King), one on our middle name, missionary, and one on the church.
Readings	During the 2 year period, you will be reading 9 books that develop and support the core values and distinctives of the Alliance. You will also be reading the ultimate supporting text of the CMA, the Bible, twice. You will be reading the Bible in two different versions of your choice.
Bible Memory	Each month you will be memorizing at least 2 passages of Scripture that support and develop the major doctrines of the Christian church. For example, you will be memorizing Scriptures that support the inerrancy of Scripture, the deity of Christ, the humanity of Christ, the deity of the Holy Spirit, some of the attributes of God, justification, sanctification, etc.
Classes/Workshops	You will be required to attend several classes/workshops that will equip you in growing a healthy church, leading someone to Christ, sharing your faith story, the role of missions in the world, etc.
Exams	At the conclusion of this two year process, you should be able to complete a written exam of 120 essay questions on all of the above topics. You will also go before the CDCMA License and Ordination/Consecration Committee to defend your answers using the Word of God.
